## MID ISLAND CADORA 2022 SUMMER DRESSAGE FESTIVAL | BRONZE Show Rules and Regulations

Please read all rules carefully as many have been updated for the 2022 show!

### General Rules

1. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.
2. **Location: Arbutus Equestrian Centre, 1515 East Island Highway, Parksville, BC (AMEC)**
3. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of Equestrian Canada of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A602.2); and in particular Section E, Dressage 2020. Knowledge of the rules is the responsibility of the competitor. **All competitors are advised to check the rule changes on the Dressage Canada web site: [www.dressagecanada.org](http://www.dressagecanada.org)**
4. **ARTICLE E 4.0 SAFETY HEADGEAR:** all riders, regardless of age or level or competition, must wear ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location. **Note:** At the tack check which follows the test, the steward may ask the rider to dismount so that the helmet may be inspected for the ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN label. **The penalty for contravention is elimination.**
5. Hors Concours are not permitted (A603.1.m, A808, E7.11.11) without advance permission from show officials.
6. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, while at the event location be selected for equine medication control testing (Article A602.5).
7. **All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations.** See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.
8. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.
9. ALL TESTS WILL BE HELD IN A 20X60 METER RING.
10. Arbutus Meadows Equestrian Centre will remain open at all times for all competitors. (E.7.14.3)
11. Callers are allowed in all but freestyle and FEI classes as per EC Rules. Competitors must provide their own callers.
12. Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times while on the Show Grounds, failure to do so may result in elimination. (E.7.11.2)
13. **Schooling of horses may only be done by EC Sport License holders.** (E.7.11.12.1) See Schooling Horses section of the rules for more information.
14. Lunging is permitted in specified areas only. Only the rider, owner, coach, groom or Person Responsible is permitted to lunge and it must be under the supervision of the steward. Please be respectful of other exhibitors. (E.7.11.12.4)
15. The outdoor sand warm up ring will be available throughout the entire weekend at designated times which will be posted with ride times as well as at the show grounds.
16. The show committee reserves the right to limit the number of tests ridden per horse per day.
17. Arbutus Meadows Equestrian Centre, Mid Island Cadora, and the Show Committee will not be responsible in any way for damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, pets, or property of spectators, riders, owners, grooms, or trainers.
18. **Dogs must be leashed and under control at all times on the grounds.** Dog Owners will be asked to remove unruly dogs.
19. Parking for spectators and horse trailers will be on the northwest side of the big indoor. We will have signs up so please respect them and our grounds supervisors.
20. **There is camping available in designated areas** at AMEC. There is NO power or water hookup. Please note, there will be a charge of \$30.00+gst per night/per vehicle for camping. Please let the **ENTRY SECRETARY** know BEFORE the show if you need a camping pass.
21. MICA will be taking photographs. If you do not wish to be photographed, please let the show office know and/or note on your entry form. Photos may be used by MICA for future advertising.
22. If you have any shoeing problems with your horse please see us at the show office and we will have our farrier to your horse as soon as possible.
23. Amenities: There are flush bathrooms available on site.
24. **Do not arrive at the show grounds prior to 3pm Friday, August 5.** If you need to access the grounds before 3pm please contact the **ENTRY SECRETARY** to determine whether this is possible.
25. **The show office will be open the following hours unless otherwise specified: Friday, 3pm-6pm. On Saturday and Sunday, it will open 45 minutes prior to the start of the classes.**
26. **Ride times will be available ONLINE once they are available, but no later than August 3, at 8pm at [www.midislandcadora.com](http://www.midislandcadora.com) or contact the ENTRY SECRETARY after this time.**
27. **Rider/Owner must present the ENTRY SECRETARY with the following documentation for the horse to receive a number: a valid Current Year EC horse license and Horse Council of BC Membership.**

## Entry Rules

1. **Entries received AFTER the ENTRY CLOSING DATE will NOT be accepted.** There are no exceptions.
2. Please use one entry form for each horse/rider combination.
3. All emailed entries must include a scan of both the owner's and rider's 2022 HCBC membership and Equestrian Canada 2022 Bronze Sport License.
4. Competitors wishing to ride in the Amateur category must include a scanned of a current EC Sport License showing Amateur Status as designated by EC. Entries not showing proof of Amateur status will be entered in Open Classes.
5. No competitor is eligible to compete until the entry form has been signed by the person responsible (please see the Waiver form for the definition of "Person Responsible").
6. **Only completed, legible entries that include all scanned and fully signed and dated waivers will be accepted. An incomplete entry will be subject to a \$25.00 incomplete entry fee.**
7. Entries must be emailed to the **ENTRY SECRETARY**. Please **do not** postal mail entries.
8. Corrections on entries and monies owing must be cleared up before entries close or entry will be void.
9. **PAYMENTS** can be made by eTransfer to the email address on the front page. eTransfer will be deposited prior to the start of the show.
10. Stall Deposit Cheques or cash can be brought to the Show Office upon arrival.
11. The show committee reserves the right to limit, to two, the number of horses ridden by a rider (A.805.5), also to limit the number of entries, the number of tests ridden by a rider, Bronze and Gold combined, and/or refuse any entry, split, cancel, or combine and/or adjust classes or awards, govern all conditions of the show, and make decisions upon any matter not covered by current EC rules.
12. Entries received prior to the **ENTRY CLOSING DATE**, but after the competition is full, will be put on a waiting list. They will not be subject to late fees if accepted into the show. If the competitor does not wish to be on the wait list or does not get into the show, all entry fees will be refunded.
13. Before the **ENTRY CHANGES DEADLINE**, entry changes can be made for \$25.00 per change at the discretion of the entry secretary and show chair.
14. After the **ENTRY CHANGES DEADLINE**, horse and rider substitutions may only be made in the event of illness or injury with Veterinarian or Physician certificate, providing that the class, test and rider category remain the same. These changes are subject to a \$25.00 office fee. Once a horse or rider has withdrawn from the show, for any reason, these substitutions can no longer be made. Substitutions must be made at the time of withdrawal. A certificate must be presented prior to the start of the show. You cannot substitute both the horse and rider in the same entry.
15. **After the ENTRY CHANGES DEADLINE, ABSOLUTELY no Entry changes will be made. No exceptions.**

## Class Rules

1. Classes can be scheduled any time of the day and freestyles will run late Saturday afternoon.
2. Ride times may be rescheduled at any time due to scratches, errors, overlapping times, unforeseen conflicts, or to facilitate the running of the show.
3. Competitors must check the scoreboard for updated rides schedules on the morning of each show day. In the case of a discrepancy between the posted day sheets and any other published ride schedule, the day sheet posted will be considered correct.
4. The show committee reserves the right to combine rider categories within classes (Jr/AA/Open) where permitted.
5. Tests, rosettes & ribbons can be picked up at the show office after the class is completed and scored. Awards must be picked up by the end of the show or will be forfeited.
6. Technical test ties will be broken by collective marks. Ties remaining after collective marks will stay tied.
7. Western Dressage entrants are not eligible for regular level class, regular division, or show hi-point awards. Separate prizes will be provided for Western Dressage entrants.

## Freestyle Rules

1. Freestyles will run Saturday late afternoon.
2. Freestyle music must be in CD format (**no m3ps or DVDs please**).
3. Music must be clearly labeled with the rider's name, competition number, and any instructions.
4. It is the responsibility of the rider to pick up their CD before the end of the show or it will be thrown out.
5. All freestyles are classified as Open. Entries may not ride more than a single freestyle or cross-enter to the Gold Level freestyle classes.
6. Bronze competitions require no minimum technical score. A rider in a bronze competition may enter a freestyle without having ridden a technical test in the level of the freestyle entered. (E.10.6)

## Refunds

1. Prior to the show **ENTRY CLOSING DATE**, all fees will be refunded, **less the administration fee**.
2. **With notice not later than noon, five (5) days after the ENTRY CLOSING DATE**, class and stabling fees will be refunded with a veterinarian or physician's certificate. **A certificate must be presented before the start of the show for any fees to be refunded. Administration fees will not be refunded.**

## Stabling

1. Stall rental is \$80 for the weekend, from 3pm Friday until 3pm Sunday. Daily rates are \$40/day.
2. A clean stall deposit of \$50 is required on a separate cheque. Strip the stall and have it inspected before leaving in order to reclaim your clean stall deposit.
3. Please indicate any special stabling requests on the entry form (eg. Stallion Stall) and we will **TRY** to accommodate but cannot guarantee requests.
4. Any damage to the stall will be the responsibility of the competitor and/or the owner of the horse.
5. Bedding will be supplied.

**Schooling Horses** are permitted to attend completion grounds for schooling purposes for a fee of \$35 a day or \$50 for the show. A Bronze Level Entry Form must be completed, and number assigned for all schooling horses by the **ENTRY CLOSING DATE**. Stabling is available at the rates shown on the entry form. All fees including the Bronze administration fee must be paid and the Entry form complete with the signed Waiver. Drug Testing Fees and DC Levy Fees are not applicable for Schooling Horses. Schooling of horses may only be done by EC Sport License holders (E.7.11.12.1).

Handlers/Person's Responsible must have HCBC and provide proof of such. Late Fees are applicable after the **CLOSING DATE** for all Schooling Horse Entries. All Handlers/Person's Responsible and Schooling Horses shall be governed by the current rules of Equestrian Canada and any additional rules set by the competition.

## BRONZE SHOW AWARDS AND PRIZELIST

Rosettes and ribbons will be awarded to 1st place to 6th place. Tests and rosettes can be picked up with the tests after the class is completed and scored. See Class Rules #4 regarding possible class combinations.

**Awards must be picked up before the end of the show.**

A minimum combined score of 55% must be obtained for Champion, and 50% for Reserve Champion awards to apply. The competitor with the highest average of the highest percentages of two technical tests at each level and category will be used as scores to determine Champion and Reserve Champion. In the event of a Division tie, the rider with the highest single percentage is declared the winner (E.9.10.5).

Freestyle scores do NOT count for regular Division or Show Hi Point Awards.

Riders must ride at least two tests in each level to be eligible for Division Champion and Reserve Champion awards. Division Championship and Reserve Championship awards are based on the following Schedule:

<b>Walk Trot Level</b>	Junior, Adult Amateur, and Open Combined
<b>Training Level</b>	Junior, Adult Amateur, and Open Combined
<b>First Level</b>	Junior, Adult Amateur, and Open Combined
<b>Second Level</b>	Junior, Adult Amateur, and Open Combined
<b>Third Level</b>	Junior, Adult Amateur, and Open Combined
<b>Fourth Level</b>	Junior, Adult Amateur, and Open Combined
<b>Freestyle</b>	Champion and Reserve: Highest and Second Highest Percentage of the Show
<b>Western Dressage</b>	Entrants are not eligible for regular level class, division, or show hi-point awards. Separate prizes will be provided to Western Dressage entrants.

5. The Person Responsible for a horse is an adult who has, or shares, responsibility for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules and is liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violation of the EC Rules. The Person Responsible must hold an EC individual or group license. (see A203.5) For the purpose of these Rules, the Person Responsible is normally the trainer, owner or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during an event, or a parent or legal guardian in the case of junior competitors. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed in the stables by himself or herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised. Parents and guardians are entitled to sign their children's entry forms without being EC members or hold of a sport license, provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rule Book. However, If the parent is also the Person Responsible (for the horse), they must hold an EC individual or group license (A203.5).

## **PAGE 2 - WAIVER**

- The riders' signature on the Waiver

## Statement of Principle

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owner's, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices;
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions;
- Reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct, or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.
